Check-In Process

Normal check-in time is 1400 hours. Earlier check-in may be available by checking with the Front Desk attendants. If quarters are not available, guests may be asked to check back with the Front Desk for an available room.

Lodging guests must provide a valid credit card at time of check-in, or pay in advance at check-in with cash or check. All long-term guests (staying over 15 days), whether paying by cash, check or credit card will return to the Front Desk at 15 day intervals to pay their lodging bill or pay in advance for the next 15 days. Any unpaid fees or charges will be charged to the credit card on file per AFMAN 34-135.

Note: All guests staying on a “space-available” and “PCS-out” basis must pay room charges in advance.

Check-Out Time

Guest check-out time is at 1100 hours. To request a late check-out, please contact the Front Desk.

Approvals are made by the Housekeeping Manager and are based on occupancy and staffing-levels. Guests may check-out by calling the Front Desk from their room, or by checking-out with the Front Desk in person.

Credit Cards and Check Policy

Holloman Inn’s billing-system accepts only **Visa, Mastercard, and American Express**. Holloman Inn also accepts personal checks for the amount of the fee only. Checks must be preprinted with your name and rank, complete home address, military organization, and both home and duty phone numbers.

Advisory: A fee of \$25.00 is charged on all returned checks

No Smoking Policy

AFMAN 34-135 states that all Air Force Lodging common areas and guest rooms (to include TLF units) are non-smoking areas.

Advisory: The Holloman Wing Commander mandated Holloman Air Force Base to be a “Tobacco Free Installation”. As such, tobacco products may only be utilized in designated areas. This guidance is outlined in AFI 40-102 (4 Mar 2015). For information on Designated Tobacco Areas (DTA), please contact the Front Desk.

Any guest who smokes in any Holloman Inn guest room, or undesignated area, will be reminded of the AFI and/or the Installation’s Policy. In addition, the guest may be charged up to a **\$150.00** cleaning service fee.

Cleaning Fees

At the manager’s discretion, guests may be charged up to a \$150.00 cleaning-fee for excessive cleaning if the room attendants are unable to return the room to available inventory. Excessive cleaning fees are defined as but not limited to: large stains and/or spills on the carpet, excessive garbage cluttering the room, damages, etc.

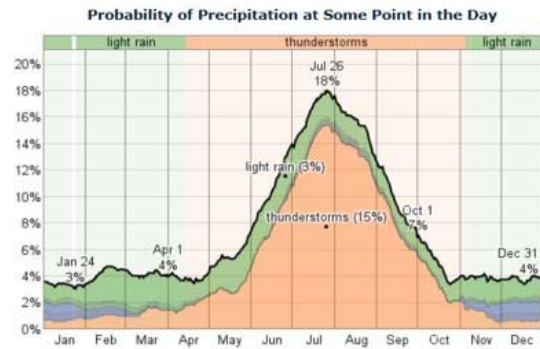

Wet Season

- Jun - Sep
- Stay indoors
- If you must leave, drive 10mph slower than the speed limit
- Hydroplaning is a serious threat during thunderstorms



Flooding

- Due to dry soil, rain is not absorbed properly causing it to drain and collect in low areas causing floods
- Do not attempt to drive through flooded areas
- Animals will head to higher ground



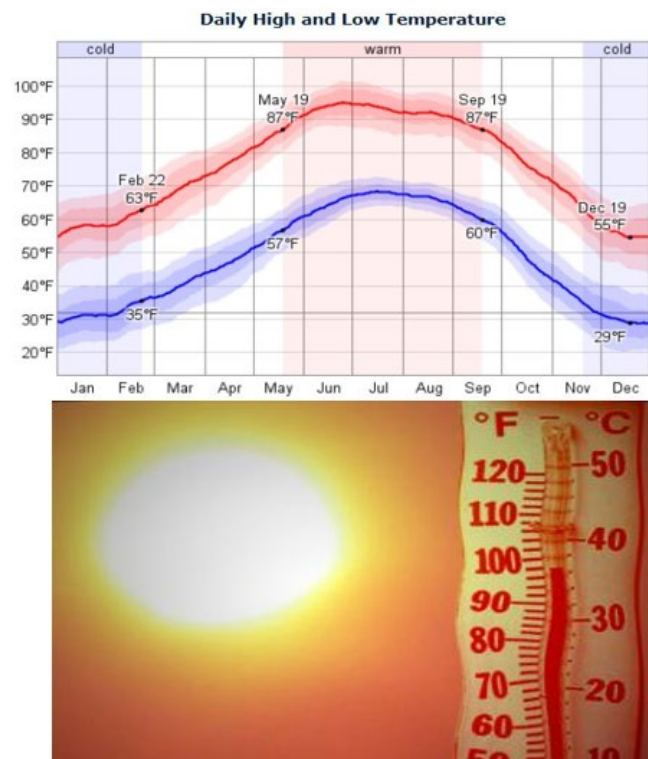
High Winds

Wildfires


- 90% are started by humans

Natural Disasters

Various natural disasters can occur near or on Holloman AFB; they can range from thunderstorms to extreme heat. You should be aware of and always on the look out for these natural disasters. Notify Security Forces if you see or hear anything out of the ordinary; that could be warning signs for a natural disaster. Notification for natural disasters will come in a 3-5 minute steady tone over the giant voice or you may get an AtHoc notification. You may need to seek shelter indoors when notified of severe weather. If you have to evacuate please proceed of the building quickly, safely, and calmly to your facility's pre-determined location. Evacuation is used to separate personnel from a threat that may be occurring or is going to occur. The first person to arrive at the location should sweep the area for any hazards to include suspicious items, any possible explosives devices. If hazards are found, report findings to proper authorities and direct arriving individuals to an alternate location. Once in a safe location, take accountability of everyone in the immediate area.

Active Shooter

An Active shooter is when an individual actively engages in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area. Notification of such an event will consist of a message from the giant voice saying “Lockdown, Lockdown, Lockdown”. The message will also include the last known location of the shooter. If you are in immediate danger of the active shooter; attempt to escape safely and quickly, seek cover if escape is not possible, or take action as a last resort. If you are directed to lockdown, lock all doors and windows, close all blinds, and move to a location inside away from windows or openings and try to hide behind something solid. This is to deter the shooter from making the effort to find you; Active shooters tend to look for the easiest targets.

Shelter-In-Place

Shelter In Place (SIP) is the use of a structure and its indoor atmosphere to temporarily separate individuals from a hazardous outdoor atmosphere. Notification for such an event will be in the form of a giant voice message and/or an AtHoc message. The message will include the areas of the base that are required to Shelter in Place. When notified of SIP, immediately report to your designated Shelter in Place room. Turn off HVAC if possible and wait for further instructions.

Lodging Information

Housekeeping Service

Housekeeping services are provided daily unless a Do Not Disturb sign is displayed on your door.

Do Not Disturb signs are provided to inform the room attendants that no service is requested. If you desire service, signs must be removed from the exterior door knob before 1300. Signs cannot be left for more than three days. If a Do Not Disturb sign is not removed by 1300 on the third day, the room will be entered by staff members.

Room attendants begin cleaning rooms that are scheduled for check-out at 0830. Please place your Do Not Disturb signs prior to this time. Do Not Disturb signs are not issued to pet rooms. Pet rooms must receive service daily. Guests can arrange with the Housekeeping Manager at extension 1326, or the Front Desk, a time to receive service.

High Chairs, Pack & Plays, Kennels and Bibles are available from the Front Desk upon request.

If you experience any problems where repairs are necessary, notify the front desk. A work order will be prepared and forwarded to the Maintenance Department.

Linen is fresh upon check-in and changed weekly thereafter. If needed, extra linen is available at the Front Desk. Fresh towels, washcloths and bath mats are provided daily.

Room Attendants are not permitted to touch personal items of guests. Please keep personal items neatly put away so Room Attendants can properly and safely clean the rooms. Hours of service, 0830-1630 and may vary on holidays/occupancy level.

We will strive to make your stay in our family quarters as relaxing and comfortable as possible. Because the family quarters contains furnishings and equipment not found in our other guest rooms, we ask that you please assist us with the cleanliness of these units while you make it your home.

Daily housekeeping is provided. The room attendant is not responsible for cleaning dishes, stoves and refrigerators during occupancy. These items are the responsibility of the occupant.

Pest Control

The control of pests, primarily the roach which is known in this part of the country as the “Texas Water Bug”, is an ongoing problem. These creatures, along with the field mice, small harmless lizards, and numerous flying insects love the climatic conditions in this area. If you see any of these unregistered guests, call the Front Desk. You can help too, by properly discarding waste food items and keeping perishable items in the refrigerator.

The Civil Engineering Squadron has restricted Lodging from using any kind of pest chemicals. Guests however, are permitted to purchase their own chemical sprays for pest control.

Business Services

Fax, copy and scanning services are available at the Front Desk. The cost for faxing on the commercial line is \$1.00 per page, excluding the cover page. Our fax number is: 575-572-7753 (commercial).

Meeting Rooms

We offer three conference rooms to our registered lodging guests. Two are located in Bldg. 330, 2nd floor and the third is inside of building 583. Use of these rooms is free of charge. Please contact our Guest Service Manager for scheduling/availability.

Fitness Room

We have a Fitness Room located in building 330 on the first floor (for lodging guests only). For guests not in this proximity you may utilize the Fitness Center located behind lodging building 587.

Civilian Guest Entitlements

Civilian employees occupying government lodging while in official TDY status are authorized access to numerous base activities. Our Front Desk personnel are authorized to stamp your official travel orders, which permit you to utilize these facilities.

Sundries

Sundry items (snacks, beverages, microwave meals) are provided at the Front Desk as a convenience to our guests. In order to comply with State Laws, alcoholic beverages can only be sold by desk clerks over the age of 21. In an event where there are no desk clerks over 21 on duty, no alcoholic beverages will be sold.

Ice Machines

Ice Machines are located in the following areas:

- Building 582-First floor in the laundry room
- Building 583-In the lobby
- Building 585, 586 and 587-Breezeway in center of the building
- Building 590, 592 and 593-In the laundry room at the end of the building
- Building 337 and 338- First floor in laundry room
- Building 330-In the laundry room area-one downstairs and one upstairs

Mail

Lodging personnel do not accept personal mail or deliveries for guests.

The General Delivery/Postal Service Office is in Building 785. Anyone who is TDY here for more than 3 months, must acquire a PO Box. If staying less than 3 months, they may use General Delivery. However, they must first notify the Postal Service Office and fill out a contact card. If you have any questions please call the Postmaster at 575-572-3192. For your convenience, postage stamps can be purchased at our Front Desk.

Weapons

Weapons and ammunition of any type are not permitted in any Holloman Inn guest room. If you have an item you are unsure of, contact Security Forces at 572-7171 for information about storage requirements.

Classified Storage

If you have classified documents, contact the Command Post at 572-4900. They are located in building 29.

Your safety and security of your personal property is important to us. Please consider following safety-measures:

Fire Safety

Do not smoke in the rooms

Do not store highly flammable liquids (gas, lighter fluid, etc.) in your room

Do not use cooking or heating devices in your room other than those provided

Do not use charcoal grills except in authorized park areas

Do not leave cooking equip. unattended if you live in quarters that have kitchens

Do not place hot appliances in lockers, drawers, or on the carpet

Do not leave appliances connected when you leave the room

Do not overload electrical circuits! Use of extension cords or multiple plugs is prohibited

Do not have candles of any kind in guest rooms

Motor Vehicle

Properly secure your motor vehicle and remove your personal belongings to your room. We cannot be responsible for your motor vehicle or its contents.

Room Security

- Do not allow anyone into your room without first verifying who it is.
- If a person claims to be an employee of the Holloman Inn, call the Front Desk and verify the identity of the person and their purpose for entering your room.
- If there is any question as to the identity of the person at your door, notify the Front Desk of the situation.
- Rooms are equipped with a viewing port (peep-hole) on the door to assist you in the identification process.

Locking Devices

- Close the door securely behind you whenever entering or leaving your room.
- Use all of the locking devices provided on your door (deadbolt, U-bolt).
- Ensure that all windows and connecting doors are locked by visually checking that they are secure and in proper working order.

Room Keys

- Safeguard your room key.
- Do not leave your room key in your room, in the door, or in other places where it can be easily stolen.
- If your room key is misplaced, immediately report it to the Front Desk.
- Keys are sensitive to electronics, cell phones, and static. Therefore we encourage you to keep keys away from these items as much as possible.

Cash and Valuables

- Do not draw attention to yourself by displaying cash, valuables or jewelry.
- Do not leave valuables in your motor vehicle.
- Do not leave valuables or cash lying around in your room.
- Safes are available in all rooms for securing valuables.

Emergency Evacuation

Note the location of your room and determine your route of escape in the unlikely event of fire or other emergency. Call the Front Desk to report fire, smoke or an emergency. In the event of a fire, move quickly and calmly to the nearest safe fire exit and leave the building.

Concerns, Requests for Assistance

If you notice any situation that is suspicious report your observations immediately to the Front Desk or Security Forces, 572-7171.

Safe Operating Instructions

Using Personal Code

To lock the safe: Enter any 3 to 6 digit code then press the “#” key, the word “CLOSED” appears and the safe will be locked.

To unlock the safe: Enter the 3 to 6 digit code that you used to lock the safe, the word “OPENED” appears and the safe will be unlocked.

Using a Credit Card (card with a magnetic strip)

To lock the safe: Slide your credit card firmly from right to left with the magnetic strip down, the word “CLOSED” appears and the safe will be locked.

To unlock the safe: Slide your credit card firmly from right to left with the magnetic strip down, the word “OPENED” appears and the safe will be unlocked.

Important Notice: Swipe the card firmly and evenly from left to right. If the card is swiped an incorrect direction or the swiping speed is too fast or too slow, the display will show “ERROR” or “AGAIN”. You need to swipe your card again. The card to unlock the safe should be the same as the card to lock the safe, if not the display will show “E-CARD”.

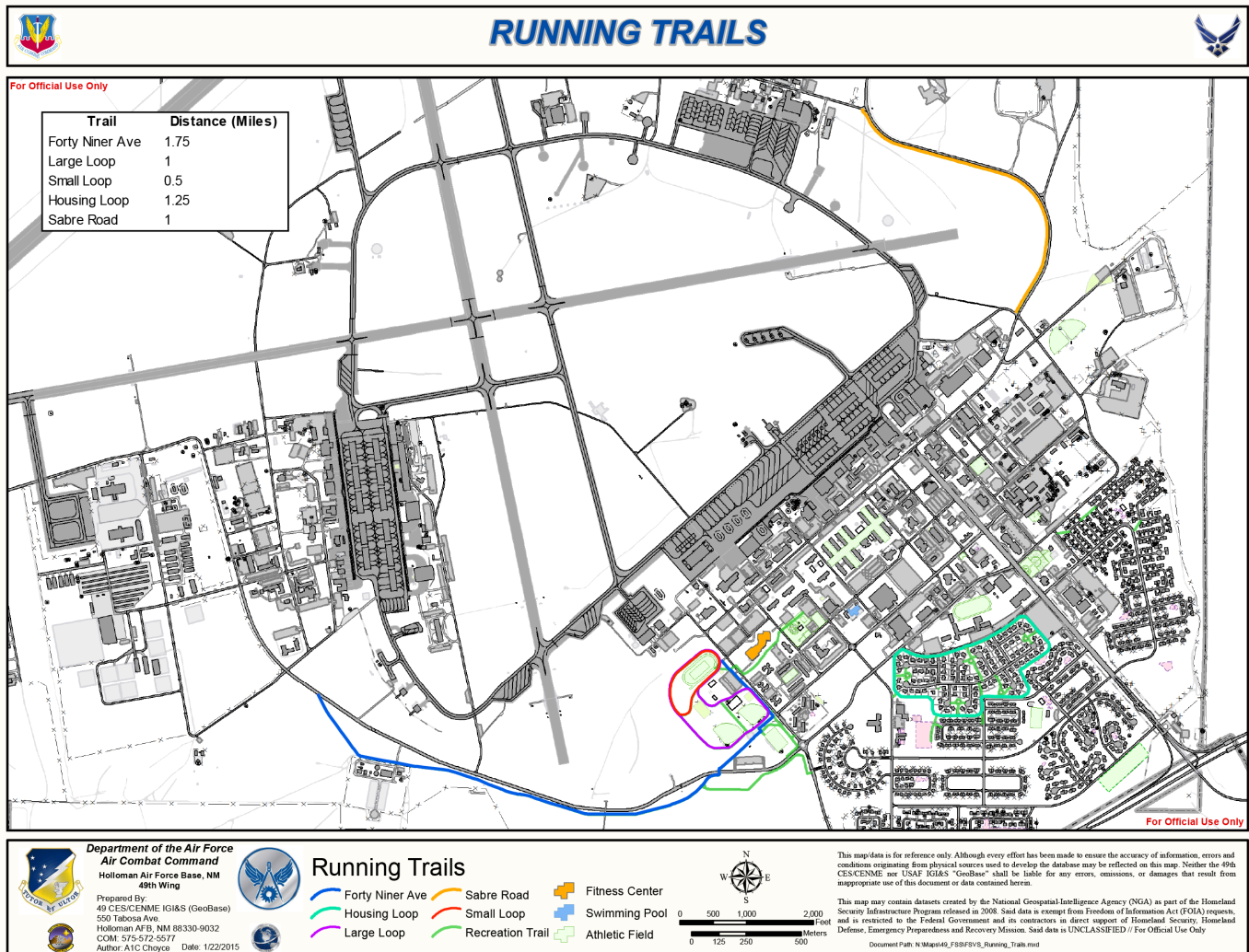

The building that houses the museum began its life in 1898 as a working train depot in Torrance, New Mexico at the junction of the New Mexico Central Railroad and the El Paso and Northeastern Railroad. Later, the building was moved to Corona, New Mexico, where it remained for 75 years, serving the Rock Island and Southern Pacific railroads. The building retains its original stamped tin ceiling tiles as well its dispatcher's bay window. The Toy Train Depot is a toy store and railway museums, featuring scale models of train locomotives and passenger and freight cars, in Alamogordo, New Mexico. The Toy Train Depot is also home to

America's Park Ride Train Museum, which runs the Alamogordo/Alameda Park Narrow Gauge Railway, a working, 16 in (406 mm) gauge miniature railway that visitors can ride for a nominal fee. The store and museum are non-profit, and are run by the Toy Train Depot Foundation. In January 2007 the Alamogordo McDonald's donated their Ronald's Railroad, full-sized, standard-gauge caboose to the museum. The caboose is now in a high-visibility location on US-54/70, alerting potential visitors to the museum's location. Guided tours by volunteer docents are available upon request. (Wikipedia, 2017)

Base History

On 10 June 1942, an event occurred that permanently changed the face of the Tularosa Basin. Alamogordo Army Airfield was established at a site six miles west of Alamogordo. Initial plans called for the base to serve as the center for the British Overseas Training program; the British hoped to train aircrews over the open New Mexico skies. However, everything changed when the Japanese launched a surprise attack on the Hawaiian Islands on 7 December 1941. The British decided to discontinue its overseas training program, and the United States saw the location as an opportunity to train its own growing military. Construction began at the airfield on 6 February 1942 and forces began to move in on 14 May 1942.

From 1942-1945, Alamogordo Army Airfield served as the training grounds for over 20 different groups, flying primarily B-17's, B-24's and B-29's. Typically, these groups trained at the airfield about six months, before heading to combat at either the Pacific or European Theater. The 450th Bombardment Group was one of the many to cut its teeth in Alamogordo. After training, the group went on to serve in nearly every major combat operation in Italy, France, Germany, Austria, Hungary, and the Balkans. During their combat service, the 450th garnered two distinguished unit citations and 11 campaign credits.

After World War II, the future of the base was uncertain. Rumors spread concerning the closure of the site, fueled by the fact that most operations had ceased. However, in 1947, a new era began when Air Material Command announced that the airfield would be the primary for testing and development site for its pilotless aircraft, guided missiles, and other research programs. For the next 25 years, the site which became known as Holloman Air Development Center and later the Air Force Missile Development Center, launched many missiles including Tiny Tim (the first Army Rocket), Rascal, V-2, XQ-2 Drone, Falcon, MACE, Matador and Shrike.

On 13 January 1948, the Alamogordo installation was renamed Holloman Air Force Base, in honor of the late Col. George V. Holloman, a pioneer in guided missile research. Holloman Air Force Base wrote its name in the annals of American history in the 1950's and 1960's. On 10 December 1954, Lt Col. (Dr.) John P. Stapp received the nickname "The Fastest Man Alive" when he rode a rocket propelled test sled, Sonic Wind No. 1, to a speed of 632 miles per hour. Additionally, Capt. Joseph W. Kittenger Jr. stepped out of an open balloon gondola at 102,800 feet on 16 August 1960, in an attempt to evaluate techniques of high altitude bailout. Capt. Kittenger's jump lasted 13 minutes reaching a velocity of 614 miles per hour. That jump broke four world records-highest open gondola manned balloon flight, highest balloon flight of any kind, highest bailout, and longest free fall. A final noteworthy event occurred on 29 November 1961, when ENOS, a chimpanzee trained at Holloman Aero-Medical Laboratory, was the first U.S. specimen launched into orbit. ENOS was launched in a Mercury-Atlas capsule that completed two orbits around the earth and was safely recovered three hours, 21 minutes later.

Another new era began in the Tularosa Basin on 1 July 1968, when the 49th Tactical Fighter Wing arrived at Holloman Air Force Base. The 49th's F-4 Phantom II's introduced a new era of fighter aircraft training and operations which continue today. In 1977, the 49th transitioned to the F-15 Eagle, the Air Force's top air to air weapon. In 1992 Holloman Air Force Base again garnered national attention when the Air Force's most technologically advanced fighter, the F-117A Nighthawk made its new home at Holloman. Today, Holloman Air Force Base continues to serve at the forefront of military operations, with the F-16 and MQ-9 "Reaper" aircraft models.
